## 1. Background and Scope

Amnesty International – Italy and CIRPS (Inter-university Research Centre for Sustainable Development – Sapienza University, Rome) are proud to present the third **International Summer School on Human Rights, Humanitarian Aid and International Cooperation**.

**Amnesty International** is a worldwide movement of people who campaign for internationally recognized human rights for all. Its mission is to conduct research and generate action to prevent and end grave abuses of human rights and to demand justice for those whose rights have been violated.

**CIRPS** was founded in April 1988 as a Centre of Excellence managed as an Inter-university Department created by nine Italian Universities and located at Sapienza University, Rome. CIRPS' mission is to promote and implement activities related to sustainable economic and social development at international level in cooperation with Italian and international Institutions and organisations.

The third edition of the Summer School will be a 7 day residential intensive course for a total amount of **60 hours, from 5 July to 11 July 2010**. Thirty places are available for **30 graduate** students, researchers or practitioners, **both from Italy and developing countries**, who want to learn technical aspects not usually taught in masters' courses and only occasionally learnt on the field.

The **main objective** of the course is to give participants skills to work in the field of international development cooperation, humanitarian aid and human rights at local and international level, including how to:

- understand the international legal system in human rights protection;
- develop scientific skills in the field of human rights research;
- analyse a growing inter-connectedness between the fields of human rights and environmental protection
- understand and manage projects on human rights education, development cooperation, and humanitarian aid
- deal with business and human rights as well as ethical fundraising related issues

## 2. Programme

The programme will deal with the following issues:

### ✓ Human rights, International protection instruments and International Humanitarian Law

The aim of this module is to:

- increase awareness of the instruments of International human rights protection;
- teach techniques and skills to carry out lobby activities and develop research to support human rights;
- analyse the main rules of International Humanitarian Law and raise awareness of the main issues related to its application.

✓ Humanitarian aid, International development cooperation

Over the last ten years, humanitarian aid has become a global system, moving nearly ten billion dollars a year and thousands of organizations. It also represents an instrument ensuring assistance to 30 million refugees and numerous victims.

The aim of this module is to focus on specific aspects such as:

- protection, security and emergency;
- management of stress and private health and techniques for performing investigation on the field;
- democratization processes in developing countries.

✓ Environment and human rights

There is a close connection between the protection of human rights and environmental protection in the context of sustainable development. The module reflect the growing interrelationship between approaches to ensuring human rights and environmental protection, as well as the synergies that have developed between these previously distinct fields.

The aim of the module is to:

- increase awareness on connection between human rights and environment
- provide a conceptual framework for using human rights in protecting the environment
- develop and strengthen the human rights and environment linkage in relation to a case study

✓ "Business and Human Rights" and Sustainability Reporting

Economic players, especially companies that operate across national boundaries (trans-national companies), have gained unprecedented power and influence across the world economy. This has not always benefited the societies in which they operate.

Companies may cause harm by directly abusing human rights, or by colluding with others who violate human rights. Despite this potential to cause significant harm, there are few effective mechanisms at national or international level to prevent corporate human rights abuses or to hold companies to account. This means those affected by their operations – often already marginalized and vulnerable - are left powerless, without the protection to which they are entitled, or meaningful access to justice.

The aim of the module is to:

- increase awareness on the impact companies can have on the human rights of the individuals and communities affected by their operations;
- provide an overview on the international policy and the initiatives aimed at adopting global standards on business and human rights and stronger legal frameworks at both national and international level to hold companies to account for their human rights impact
- inform about sustainability reporting as a tool to assess company operations and policies, as well as to benchmark company performance against the principal international standards for human rights

✓ Ethical Fundraising

In recent years, controversies at major nonprofit organizations have created new public concern about, and focused media attention on, the ethics of fundraising. National trade

and professional groups have responded with the establishment or revision of codes of ethics for their members.

The aim of the module is to:

- applies an ethical framework to a wide range of situations familiar to nonprofit development officers, volunteers, and organizations
- to illustrate what does ethics in nonprofit organization management mean in the practical daily life: including demographics and donor motivation, strategies, marketing, ethics, regulation and law, cost-effectiveness and financial management
- to provide study cases presenting ethical dilemma designed to stimulate moral reasoning and discussion on developing and refining a code of ethics for the organization.

✓ Human rights education

The aim of this module is to:

- increase awareness of human rights;
- develop useful skills for the construction of educational paths.

The module will deal with the following issues:

- active listening and communication;
- critical thinking;
- ability to actively participate in working groups;
- actions for the promotion and protection of human rights at local and global level.

### **3. Methodology**

The course will have an interactive approach with a theoretical structure. Lessons will be supported by debates, simulations, workshops, case-studies and working groups. Ideas and answers will be given through debates and introducing theories, approaches and concrete experiences realized through cooperation projects and case-studies and/or witnesses.

Film screenings and informal activities are scheduled to take place in the evening. Participants will be able to take part in "night talks" on specific issues discussed during the day. Classes will be supported by multimedia and audio-visual material.

The whole course will be carried out in a highly professional atmosphere, with international experts in development, cooperation, business ethics and sustainability and professors from Sapienza University, Rome, Amnesty International and European institutions.

### **4. Location**

The Summer School will take place at the **University Centre in Pomezia** in the **Selva dei Pini** residential complex which is a tourist-hotel resort in the middle of a 27 hectare oasis of gardens and woods located along the Via Pontina 20 minutes from Roma EUR (about 17 km). The university campus provides all equipped classrooms, laboratories and sports grounds (swimming pool, football fields, tennis courts) which guarantee the opportunity of experiencing a highly innovative form of education, oriented towards creativity and cultural exchange. Triple rooms are provided with telephone, private bathroom, air-conditioning/heating and television.

### **5. Participants**

The summer school is open to **30 Italian and foreign graduates (5 of which from developing countries)** in human and social science, economics, development, environment and related fields, **post doctoral students, young academics, researchers and practitioners** including those currently working in the field of international cooperation, human rights education and protection and humanitarian aid.

## **6. Fees**

The fee for the Summer School is **€ 400,00**, excluding travel expenses.

The fee includes:

- 7 days classes (tuition and tutorship);
- 7 nights accommodation in triple rooms and related expenditures;
- 14 meals (lunch and dinner for 7 days, including breakfast);
- all didactic material and documents.

**N.B. The travel expenses (maximum € 500,00 per person), accommodation and board are guaranteed for 5 graduates from developing countries .**

## **7. Applications**

Applications must include a motivational letter and CV. Fluency in oral and written English is also required.

Candidates will be notified of the outcome of their applications within two weeks. Participation will be confirmed after receipt of payment. The details of payment will be provided to applicants with their confirmation of eligibility.

**N.B. The Course will not be activated if the minimum number of 20 participants will not be reached.**
